ARTICLE 8: BORDER AGENCY COOPERATION

National Coordination and Cooperation: Although the functions related to the entry and exit of merchandise are the exclusive powers of the Customs authorities, federal and local public officials, in the sphere of their competence, assist the Customs authorities in the performance of their functions. Thus, the Customs authorities exercise their powers in a coordinated manner in collaboration with the authorities of the Federal Public Administration, of the states and municipalities.

Coordination and Cooperation with Countries: Also, in accordance with the Customs National Law, the Mexican Customs authorities exercise their powers in coordination with the tax and Customs authorities of other countries as established in the provisions of the international treaties to which Mexico is a Party.

For example: Northern Border: Since 2015, the Unified Cargo Processing (UCP) with the U.S has been carried out for more than 12 sectors; involving 400 companies, 11 Customs and 16 pilot programs.
